The Greensboro Partnership to Take Trip to Raleigh

Greensboro, NC (April 21, 2010) – The Greensboro Partnership will be hosting a trip for Chamber members and other business leaders to meet with members of the North Carolina General Assembly in Raleigh on Wednesday, May 26, 2010. These Greensboro representatives will discuss the legislative agenda of the Greensboro Partnership with elected officials and advocate issues that affect the future of the city and region.
